Honorable Justices of the U.S. Supreme Court:

I urge the members of the court to rule on behalf of women's personal sovereignty, dignity, health, and human rights by upholding the Jackson Women's Health Organization in the Dobbs case. Your decision will not only impact Roe v. Wade, but also the fundamental concept of separation of church and state, and the right to bodily autonomy for trans people. Denial of access to abortion has a disproportionate effect on people of color and poor people of all races. The ability to make crucial decisions about the course of one's life should not be abridged by race, gender, income, or physical ability.

The Mississippi law bans abortion after 15 weeks of pregnancy when many women don't even know they are pregnant. The state already has some of the most restrictive abortion laws in the country, making it difficult and sometimes impossible to access abortion care. It is one of 12 states with laws in place that are intended to prohibit abortion if Roe v. Wade is overturned. This would be a disaster that would cause immeasurable harm and even death to many women.

I call on the court to rule that abortion is a human right that must be free and accessible on demand. You must put an end to states' endless efforts to subvert that right. To deny respect and self-determination to more than half the human race would be the gravest injustice.
